14-14 – An Ordinance providing for the procedure motor vehicles are to use upon approaching a stationary emergency vehicle displaying red or red and blue lights within the City and providing for punishment of violators.

14-15 – An Ordinance in regard to Weldon Spring Parkway, authorizing certain actions to obtain right-of-way and establish replacement park area and matters relating thereto.

14-16 – An Ordinance adopting the budget for the fiscal year 2015 for the City.

It is our hopes to someday (budget permitting) erect the other cabin as well in order to preserve a small piece of valuable local history.

## GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION Tuesday, April 7<sup>th</sup>, 2015

First day of filing for candidacy for the April 7<sup>th</sup>, 2015 General Municipal Election for the City of Weldon Spring begins at 8:00 A.M. on Tuesday, December 16<sup>th</sup>, 2014 and closes at 4:00 P.M. on that day only. Filing continues Monday through Friday during normal City Hall office hours (Monday through Friday between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M.) The last day to file as a candidate for this election will be January 20<sup>th</sup>, 2015. City Hall will be open on that day from 9:00 A.M. until 5:00 P.M.

The following positions are up for election on April 7<sup>th</sup>, 2015:

- Mayor – a term of two years
- Alderman – Ward I – a term of two years
- Alderman – Ward II – a term of two years (and)
- Alderman – Ward III – a term of two years

### Qualifications:

For Mayor: A candidate must be at least twenty-five (25) years of age, a citizen of the United States and an inhabitant and resident of the City for at least one (1) year preceding the election.  
For Alderman: A candidate must be at least eighteen (18) years of age, a citizen of the United States and an inhabitant and resident of the City for one year next preceding the election and a resident at the time that he/she files and during the time he/she serves of the Ward from which he/she is elected.

**RSMo 115-346:** *Notwithstanding any other provisions of law to the contrary, no person shall be certified as a candidate for a municipal office, nor shall such person's name appear on the ballot as a candidate for such office who shall be in arrears for any unpaid City taxes or municipal user fees on the last day to file a declaration of candidacy for the office.*

**RSMo 115.348:** *No person shall qualify as a candidate for elective public office in the State of Missouri who has been convicted of or found guilty of or plead guilty to a felony or misdemeanor under federal laws of the United States of America.*

## **Forest ReLeaf Provides 3<sup>rd</sup> and Final Round of Free Trees to Residents of Weldon Spring**

On Friday, October 24<sup>th</sup> city staff picked up free trees from Forest ReLeaf of Missouri and brought them back to the City Park for pick up by residents who had placed orders. The City estimates there were roughly over 600 large mature trees lost due to the damaging winds from an EF3 category tornado which struck the city in the evening hours of May 31, 2013. The tornado ripped through homes and uprooted trees, but fortunately there were no serious injuries.



This isn't the first time Forest ReLeaf has offered aid in the form of free trees to a community ravaged by a severe tornado; they provided over 4,000 young trees to residents of Joplin, MO after a devastating tornado leveled much of the community back in 2011. Weldon Spring residents were offered the opportunity to place orders of up to five trees per household from a list of tree species available from Forest ReLeaf. There were 25 different tree species in which residents could choose from and all were native to Missouri. This go around the top three picks were Eastern Redbud, followed by Red Maple and then River Birch. This is a very similar to the top three tree species from the 1<sup>st</sup> round of free streets back in fall of 2013, the only difference was white pine, which wasn't available this time.



In total after the three rounds of free trees, city residents received over 1,300 trees and shrubs from Forest ReLeaf! All plants came in three gallon containers and the trees were anywhere from 4 to 6 foot tall. If you would have to purchase comparable trees at a retail outlet on average the cost would be \$30 or more. That means the City was able to receive at least \$39,000 worth of replacement trees for residents. "The value the City and residents received through the hard work and efforts of Forest

ReLeaf is great," said Michael Padella, City Administrator. He went on to say, "We can't thank all the great folks over at Forest ReLeaf enough, from the staff to the wonderful volunteers, they are all providing a huge service to their local communities throughout the state of Missouri!"

**Beseda Flooring** once again helped out in a pinch and loaned out the use of their box truck for the pick-up efforts. "Without the use of the box truck many of the trees we picked up were protected from wind damage," said Padella.



## Clean Water is Essential for a Clean Environment

Fall is here and winter will soon follow. Please be aware of some seasonal things that you can do to help improve the water quality within the City and State waterways:

1. Dispose of gathered leaves, pet waste, chemicals, paints and other debris responsibly with your waste collector. Never dispose of these items in a stormwater inlet or creek.
2. If needed, use fertilizers and pesticides per the manufacturer’s recommendations.

Do not over fertilize.

3. Use deicing chemicals and salt sparingly and only when needed.

Making a few changes in our daily lives can significantly reduce the amount of pollutants we contribute to stormwater runoff. 

